Finding Articles

- Research databases provide access to thousands of journal articles. Find databases “by subject” or on the “alphabetical list” (links located under Find It in the Articles section of the library’s home page). Academic Search Premier is a general EBSCO database you may have used before.

Off Campus Access

Special Collections & Archives

- Located on the 12th floor of the Main Library, special collections and archives provide access to primary and rare resources. For example the May 4, 1970 Collection contains items documenting the events and aftermath of the May 4 shootings at Kent State. <http://www.library.kent.edu/speccoll>

Printing in the Library

- Printing in the Main Library costs \$.07 per black & white page.
- You’ll need to have cash loaded in your student ID (FlashCard) to pay for your print jobs at the print stations. Ask a librarian for help.

Photocopying in the Library

- \$.08 per page if you pay with your FlashCard.
- \$.15 per page if you pay with cash or coin.

Tutoring at the Library

- **Math and Writing Tutoring** available in the Information Commons from the afternoon to early evenings Monday thru Thursday. Just drop in. No appointment needed. Provided by the KSU Academic Success Center and the Writing Center.

Computer Labs

- **Information Commons:** 42 workstations with web access for doing library research and 4 express multimedia stations for scanning and CD burning.
- **Student Multimedia Studio:** 8 multimedia workstations, plus a number of specialized editing rooms and workstations. Next to Info Commons. <http://www.library.kent.edu/sms>
- **Computer Lab:** 78 workstations located next to the Information Commons provide access to the web and to a selection of software programs, including word processing.
